Minutes: May 30, 2006

1. Ramon Castella, engineer for Phase 3 of Crandon Blvd. Project presented the drawings for the 7 plazas. The Board discussed several themes for the artwork but felt that was an artists decision based on a narrative that Cesar Trasobares will prepare. The Board discussed the following themes: botanical, environmental, historical, and astrology. The Board felt the artwork should be a progression and conceptual but not design.
The engineer would prepare the specs based on the artists drawings. The artist would be retained by the Village to oversee the work. Staff was asked to large scale drawings. The Board is considering an invitation to three artists Wendy Disher, Pablo Cano, and Jose Bedia. As this work is unique, staff was asked to get a legal opinion if the Council can award the contract to a "sole source" provider. One source would be the funds that are set aside for the Fire Rescue Station and Village Hall Artwork. Staff said the Council would have to approve the design and allocate funding. Further, the artwork project can not delay the construction of Crandon Phase 3.
2. Caesar Trasobares handed out a summary of the proposed Cultural Program. Staff requested that a narrative be prepared which explains the program. The estimated cost is \$80,000. Staff suggested that the Board attend the Council's budget workshop on June 20.

3. The Board discussed the Sarah Morris project and called (on assignment in Vienna) Jay from Parallax. It was agreed Parallax would deliver to the Village by June 20 the new covers for the lights and overflow. The Village will install it. Parallax is responsible for finding a brighter lamp that would fit into the existing opening. The Board does not want to enlarge the opening. Staff advised that Hall Fountains said even a 150 wall bulb (75W was approved by Sarah Morris) would not result in a noticeable brightness due to the dispersion of light in the water.

4. The Board passed a motion to proceed with the following: Dale Andree and Co. Performance KB Islander Cartoonist Exhibit. A funding source has not been identified.
