2. **PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:** Mia Davey led the Pledge of Allegiance.

At this time the Mayor addressed the public regarding the purpose of the Special Council Meeting which is to discuss the Ultra Music Festival taking place at Virginia Key.

3. **DISCUSSION REGARDING THE ULTRA MUSIC FESTIVAL:** The Manager addressed the Council providing a status update regarding the Ultra Music Festival at Virginia Key.
